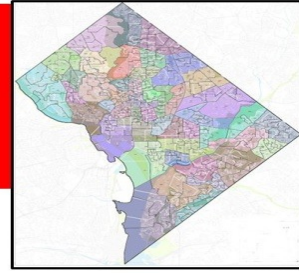

Transportation & Traffic Safety

Seventeen resolutions from eight ANCs addressed pedestrian safety, traffic calming, bicycle infrastructure, street sweeping, parking, micromobility enforcement, and transit service.

- **ANC 1A – Anti-slip metal grating, 14th & Harvard St NW:** ANC 1A called on DDOT to install anti-slip treatments on metal utility grating at the intersection of 14th Street and Harvard Street NW in Columbia Heights, citing the hazard the smooth metal surface poses to pedestrians, cyclists, and people using wheelchairs or strollers, particularly in wet conditions. [Commissioner Anthony Thomas-Davis] ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 1A – Micromobility enforcement:** ANC 1A called on DDOT and the DC government to strengthen compliance with and enforcement of micromobility guidelines and regulations,

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addressing concerns about e-scooters and e-bikes operating on sidewalks, being parked in pedestrian pathways, and operated unsafely in mixed-traffic environments. [Commissioner Anthony Thomas-Davis] ([View resolution](#))

- **ANC 1A – Pedestrian crossing signs, Lamont St at 13th St NW:** ANC 1A requested that DDOT reinstall in-street pedestrian crossing signs at the intersection of Lamont Street NW and 13th Street NW, citing removal of the signs during roadwork and the resulting increase in pedestrian safety hazards. [Commissioner Anthony Thomas-Davis] ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 1B – Late-night parking elimination, U St NW (weekends):** ANC 1B called on DDOT to eliminate parking on U Street NW during late-night weekend hours (10:30 PM–6:00 AM), in order to expand curb space for passenger vehicle pick-up and drop-off, reduce double-parking by ride-hail vehicles, and improve pedestrian flow on the corridor. - **ANC 1B – Strategic Bikeways Plan recommendations:** ANC 1B submitted recommendations to DDOT for the Strategic Bikeways Plan, including protected bicycle lanes on 14th Street NW, 11th Street NW, and Vermont Avenue NW, and calling for better connectivity to the existing network in the neighborhood. [Commissioner Matthew Holden] ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 2B – DPW street sweeping fines suspension:** ANC 2B requested that the Department of Public Works suspend enforcement of street sweeping fines in the Commission’s service area in the period immediately following the January 2026 snowstorm, noting that snow plowing operations moved parked vehicles and disrupted normal parking patterns, making enforcement during the recovery period inequitable. - **ANC 2B – Bar Charley streatory public space application:** ANC 2B endorsed the public space application submitted by Bar Charley for a streatory installation at its 14th Street NW location, supporting the proposed outdoor seating configuration in the public right-of-way. [Commissioner Zach Adams] ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 3C – 34th St/Reno Rd NW pedestrian safety:** ANC 3C wrote to DDOT regarding pedestrian safety at the intersection of 34th Street and Reno Road NW, citing multiple incidents involving child pedestrians and requesting traffic calming and crosswalk improvements. [Commissioner Janell Pagats] ([View letter](#))
- **ANC 3D – Stop sign camera, Loughboro Rd & Arizona Ave NW:** ANC 3D requested DDOT install an automated stop sign enforcement camera at the intersection of Loughboro Road and Arizona Avenue NW, citing a pattern of stop sign violations and safety concerns at this intersection. [Commissioner Duncan] ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 3D – Traffic calming, 4700 block Reservoir Rd NW:** ANC 3D requested DDOT implement traffic calming improvements on the 4700 block of Reservoir Road NW, in the vicinity of the Lab School of Washington. The resolution requested marked crosswalks, curb extensions (bulb-outs), and reduced speed limits to protect students and pedestrians in the school zone. - **ANC 3D – Road erosion, Nebraska Ave & Sherier Pl NW:** ANC 3D wrote to DDOT regarding major roadway erosion on the 2300 block of Nebraska Avenue NW at Sherier Place NW, requesting emergency repair of the deteriorating road surface. [Commissioner Tricia Duncan] ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 3D – Claudio’s Table public space relief:** ANC 3D supported the application by Claudio’s Table (Public Space Application #485465) for relief from certain conditions imposed on its outdoor public space improvements, in connection with the restaurant’s streetscape work on its block. [Commissioner Tricia Duncan] ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 3F – Van Ness Streetscape capital budget request:** ANC 3F requested that \$8–10 million be included in the FY2027 capital budget for the Van Ness Streetscape Improvement Project, which includes streetscape upgrades along Connecticut Avenue NW near the Van Ness Metro station. The

resolution noted that the project had been in planning for several years and that funding was needed to proceed to construction. [Commissioner Courtney Carlson] ([View resolution](#))

- **ANC 4D – Strategic Bikeways Plan – Ward 4 support:** ANC 4D submitted a resolution supporting the development of bikeways in Ward 4 in connection with DDOT’s Strategic Bikeways Plan process, identifying specific corridors in the Commission’s service area for bicycle infrastructure improvements. [Commissioner Jenn Kauffman] ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 4E – Longfellow St street sweeping suspension:** ANC 4E requested that DPW temporarily suspend street sweeping enforcement on Longfellow Street NW following the January 2026 snowstorm, citing disrupted parking conditions during the snow emergency recovery period. [Commissioner Vince Micone] ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 4E – NOI 25-285-TPA enforcement credibility:** ANC 4E passed a resolution regarding DDOT’s Notice of Intent 25-285-TPA, addressing enforcement credibility in the Commission’s commercial corridors. The resolution called on DDOT to follow through on stated transportation policy commitments and enforcement actions affecting the commercial areas within ANC 4E. - **ANC 5F – Strategic Bikeways Plan feedback:** ANC 5F submitted a feedback letter to DDOT on the Strategic Bikeways Plan, requesting improved bicycle connectivity along the Metropolitan Branch Trail and surrounding corridors in the Commission’s area, including connections to Eckington and Union Market. Housing, Development & Zoning

Six resolutions from five ANCs addressed housing density policy, zoning applications, development site disposition, and a mixed-use industrial rezoning.

- **ANC 1B – Gentle density – ending exclusionary zoning:** ANC 1B passed a resolution urging the DC Office of Planning and the DC Council to allow gentle density throughout the District of Columbia by reforming zoning regulations that limit housing development in single-family zones. The resolution cited the District’s housing shortage and affordability crisis and called for zoning changes enabling multi-unit residential construction across all neighborhoods. - **ANC 1B – Special Committee on the Comprehensive Plan:** ANC 1B established a Special Committee on the Comprehensive Plan to engage with the ongoing DC Comprehensive Plan amendment process, monitor land use policy developments, and ensure resident participation in planning decisions affecting the Commission’s area. - **ANC 3D – 4928 Indian Lane BZA rear yard variance:** ANC 3D took a position on BZA Application 21421 for 4928 Indian Lane NW, which sought a rear yard variance. [Commissioner Tricia Duncan] ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 4B – 6000 Chillum Pl NE zoning change:** ANC 4B passed a resolution supporting a change in the zoning designation of 6000 Chillum Place NE from its current classification to Mixed-Use Industrial, in connection with a pending zoning application for the property. [Commissioner Shamina Christian] ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 4D – Georgia Avenue surplus development:** ANC 4D passed a resolution regarding the disposition of seven surplus properties along Georgia Avenue NW, providing recommendations to the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development (DMPED) on how those properties should be developed, including priorities for affordable housing and community-serving uses. 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- **ANC 4E – Georgia Avenue properties recommendation:** ANC 4E submitted a letter to DMPED with recommendations regarding the disposition of the surplus properties at 5760–5812 Georgia Avenue NW and other nearby sites, stating the Commission’s positions on preferred uses, development standards, and community engagement requirements. *[Commissioner Nikki Jones]* ([View letter](#))
- **ANC 5E – Langston Slater redevelopment – B26-157:** ANC 5E passed a resolution calling on the DC Council to expeditiously pass Bill B26-157, which addresses the redevelopment and potential sale of the Langston Slater site. The resolution stated ANC 5E’s position on the terms of the redevelopment and the importance of community benefit provisions in any sale agreement. *[Commissioner Kyle Gardiner]* ([View resolution](#))

Environment & Public Works

Four resolutions from three ANCs addressed rodent control, air pollution, green infrastructure maintenance funding, and snow emergency response.

- **ANC 1A – Comprehensive rat mitigation reform:** ANC 1A called on the DC Council to enact comprehensive rat mitigation legislation, supporting a package of measures including mandatory rodent-resistant waste containers for residential and commercial properties, enhanced public trash receptacle maintenance, and a publicly accessible rat abatement dashboard. *[Commissioner Shira Davidson]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 3D – Green infrastructure maintenance funding:** ANC 3D wrote to Mayor Bowser and DC Water requesting dedicated funding for the maintenance of green infrastructure — including bioretention cells, tree boxes, and permeable pavement — installed as part of DC Water’s Clean Rivers Impervious Surface Reduction Program. The resolution requested that DC Water adjust its fee structure to include a dedicated maintenance fund for these assets. *[Commissioner Tricia Duncan]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 3D – Snow emergency response critique:** ANC 3D wrote to the Department of Public Works regarding the District’s response to the January 2026 snow emergency, identifying specific deficiencies in plowing operations within the Commission’s service area and requesting improvements in communication, prioritization, and contractor accountability for future snow events. *[Commissioner Bernie Horn]* ([View letter](#))
- **ANC 5F – Air pollution permitting – B26-0565:** ANC 5F endorsed B26-0565, the Strengthening Air Pollution Permitting Amendment Act of 2026, which would strengthen the District’s air pollution permitting process by requiring more rigorous environmental review of industrial facilities. ANC 5F cited the environmental justice concerns of residents in its area, including those near industrial operations in Eckington and Ivy City. *[Commissioner Aru Sahni]* ([View resolution](#))

Business, Liquor Licenses & Streateries

Five resolutions from two ANCs addressed streatory endorsements, an ABCA stipulated license, an ABCA procedural review, and sidewalk vending legislation.

- **ANC 1A – Sidewalk vending improvements (B26-0332/B26-0370):** ANC 1A passed a resolution supporting two DC Council bills related to sidewalk vending improvements in Columbia Heights: B26-0332 and B26-0370. The resolution called for better regulation of sidewalk vending locations, vendor permitting, and conflict resolution between vendors and neighboring businesses and residents. *[Commissioner Christine Miller]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 1A – Wonderland Ballroom streatory endorsement:** ANC 1A endorsed the Substantial Change Application by the Wonderland Ballroom LLC (t/a The Wonderland Ballroom) for a public space streatory at its Columbia Heights location. *[Commissioner Anthony Thomas-Davis]* ([View resolution](#))

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- **ANC 1B – ABCA procedural review and best practices:** ANC 1B passed a resolution instructing its own Committee on Alcoholic Beverage and Cannabis Regulation (ABCR) to conduct a procedural review of its licensing practices and adopt best practices in the processing of ANC protests and voluntary agreements. *[Commissioners Miguel Trindade Deramo and Stephen Hanrahan]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 2B – Gemini streatory endorsement:** ANC 2B endorsed the application by Gemini for a streatory with 10 seats at its location on 14th Street NW, supporting the outdoor dining installation in the public right-of-way. *[Commissioner Libby Franklin]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 2B – Duke’s Grocery streatory endorsement:** ANC 2B endorsed the application by Duke’s Grocery for a streatory with 16 seats at its location on 14th Street NW. *[Commissioner Libby Franklin]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 2B – M Street Pub stipulated license:** ANC 2B passed a resolution regarding the application by M Street Pub House for a stipulated license at 1825 M Street NW, stating the Commission’s conditions for support of the license application. *[Commissioner Alex Marshall]* ([View resolution](#))

Libraries, Parks & Public Facilities

Four resolutions from two ANCs addressed library and recreation center capital budgets, playground renovation, and public restroom funding.

- **ANC 3B – Guy Mason Recreation Center playground renovation:** ANC 3B passed a resolution regarding the future renovation of the playground at Guy Mason Recreation Center, requesting that the renovation proceed without inclusion of a sandbox, based on maintenance and safety concerns raised by community members. *[Commissioner Melissa Lane]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 5F – Eckington/Edgewood Library budget support:** ANC 5F requested that the DC Council continue capital budget support for the Eckington/Edgewood Library project. The resolution cited community need for improved library facilities in the neighborhoods served by ANC 5F. *[Commissioner Joe Bishop-Henchman]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 5F – Harry Thomas Recreation Center budget support:** ANC 5F requested an additional \$10 million in the FY26 capital budget for the renovation of the Harry Thomas Recreation Center in Ward 5, citing the facility’s deteriorated condition and the need for community recreation space. *[Commissioner Julia Hedlund]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 5F – Public restrooms budget support:** ANC 5F requested continued capital budget support for the District’s public restroom program, including the Throne portable restroom units, which provide accessible facilities in public spaces across the city. *[Commissioner Joe Bishop-Henchman]* ([View resolution](#))

Budget & Fiscal Policy

Four resolutions from three ANCs addressed FY26 budget priorities, transit and snow response funding, and youth wage policy.

- **ANC 4B – Pay Our Youth Fair Wage Act:** ANC 4B passed a resolution supporting the Pay Our Youth a Fair Wage Act (Bill 26-0201), which would increase wages paid to participants in the DC summer youth employment program. *[Commissioner Tiffani Nichole Johnson]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 5D – MBSYEP fair wages – Bill 26-0114:** ANC 5D passed a resolution supporting Bill 26-0114, the Ensuring Fair and Equitable Wages in the Mayor’s Better Summer Youth Employment Program Act, directed to both the DC Council and the Department of Employment Services (DOES). The resolution called for increased and equitable wages for youth participants in the summer employment program. *[Commissioner Charquinta McCray]* ([View resolution](#))

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- **ANC 5F – FY26 budget priorities feedback letter:** ANC 5F submitted a comprehensive budget priorities feedback letter to the DC Council for FY26, addressing capital and operating budget requests across multiple areas including libraries, recreation, transit, public restrooms, and infrastructure in the Commission’s area. *[Commissioner Julia Hedlund]* ([View letter](#))
- **ANC 5F – NoMa Station third entrance budget support:** ANC 5F endorsed continued capital budget support for the NoMa Station third entrance and pedestrian tunnel project. The resolution noted that the NoMa-Gallaudet University Metro Station set a record of 30,000 riders in a single day in 2025 and is now among the top ten WMATA stations by ridership. The FY2026 Capital Improvement Plan had approved \$50 million for the project — \$5 million for design in FY2027 and \$45 million for construction in FY2028. ANC 5F cited the developer of the adjacent Armature Works project, which had built its structure to accommodate the future station entrance, as awaiting the District fulfilling its long-stated commitment. *[Commissioner Joe Bishop-Henchman]* ([View resolution](#))

Education, Youth Services & Recreation

Three resolutions addressed construction work hours at a school site, WMATA emergency service during a snowstorm, and snow removal practices.

- **ANC 3D – John Thompson HS holiday work hours:** ANC 3D passed a resolution approving construction work hours at the John Thompson High School site during the upcoming holiday period, as requested by the project applicant under DC Office of Zoning regulations governing construction hours. *[Commissioner Marilyn Nowalk]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 5F – WMATA emergency service thanks (January snowstorm):** ANC 5F passed a resolution thanking WMATA for maintaining emergency rail and bus service during the January 2026 snowstorm, noting that continued transit service allowed essential workers and residents to travel when road conditions prevented vehicle travel. *[Commissioner Joe Bishop-Henchman]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 5F – Snow removal practices improvements:** ANC 5F passed a resolution requesting improvements to the District’s snow removal practices following the January 2026 snowstorm, identifying specific deficiencies in the response within ANC 5F’s service area, including delays in side street plowing, inadequate salt application, and poor communication with residents. *[Commissioner Joe Bishop-Henchman]* ([View resolution](#))

Technology & Governance

Two resolutions addressed digital platform safety and ANC organizational matters.

- **ANC 5F – Safe and open digital platforms:** ANC 5F passed a resolution calling on the District government to adopt policies requiring use of safe and open digital platforms for official government communications and public engagement, citing concerns about the reliability and safety of X (formerly Twitter) for government use. *[Commissioner Aru Sahni]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 5F – 2026 meeting calendar adoption:** ANC 5F adopted its 2026 meeting calendar, establishing the schedule of regular public meetings for the year. *[Commissioner Mark Galvan]* ([View resolution](#))

Animal Services

One resolution addressed oversight of the District’s animal care and control contract.

- **ANC 4B – Brandywine Valley SPCA animal care oversight:** ANC 4B wrote to the Department of Health with questions regarding the District’s animal care and control contract with the Brandywine

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Valley SPCA (BVSPCA), requesting information on contract performance, animal outcomes, and oversight practices. [Commissioner Tiffani Nichole Johnson] ([View letter](#))

Testimonies

JANUARY 28, 2026

District Department of Transportation (DDOT)

- › Anacostia/Ward 8 has the highest vehicle accident rate in the district despite having the lowest car ownership — the community is used as a cut-through by Maryland and Virginia commuters via Suitland Parkway and 295
- › DDOT safety improvement plans for MLK Gateway, Alabama/Marion Barry Ave, and Historic Anacostia corridors have not moved from plan to action in two years
- › New MLK Ave road extension is causing accidents and traffic backups — a car flipped over it the week before the hearing
- › Most bus shelters in 8A have been removed despite Ward 8 having the highest transit dependency, leaving seniors, students, and residents waiting on exposed sidewalks

FEBRUARY 26, 2026

Department of Human Services (DHS)

- › The Aston bridge housing facility (Ward 2) is subject to an indefinite 100-resident cap despite physical capacity of 190, established by a 2023 agreement between CM Pinto and Mayor Bowser's administration
- › The cap is policy-driven rather than performance-based, with no publicly articulated benchmarks for lifting it — leaving usable capacity offline during a budget crisis and rising demand for shelter
- › ANC 2A requests DHS define measurable performance metrics for capacity expansion, provide a detailed briefing on Aston's first year of operations, and adopt a phased capacity plan targeting 150 then 190 residents
- › In Q&A, clarified that ANC 2A majority supports lifting the cap and personally favors doing so immediately given the facility's success

MARCH 2, 2026

DC Water and Sewer Authority (DC Water)

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Trupti Patel 2A03 [Watch testimony](#)

- › DC Water infrastructure failures at the Aston (ANC 2A's bridge housing facility) including water intrusion, poor interagency coordination, and lack of community transparency
- › Chronic sewer backups at Snows Court have been addressed reactively rather than through permanent remediation
- › Water main failures at 25th and I Street NW in 2024 caused sidewalk damage and poor DDOT coordination
- › Requests DC Water to provide site-specific explanations for each incident, demonstrate operational lessons learned, improve interagency coordination for residential facilities housing vulnerable populations, and commit to permanent fixes in known problem corridors
