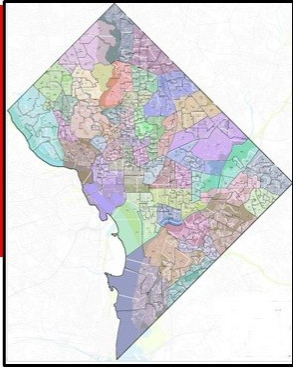

Transportation & Traffic Safety

Seven resolutions from four ANC's addressed road safety, traffic signals, pedestrian infrastructure, parking, shared mobility, and corridor studies.

- **ANC 4B – 5th Street NW stop signs:** ANC 4B requested four-way stop signs at three intersections on 5th Street NW between Nicholson and Peabody Streets. The resolution cited a student being struck by a vehicle as the catalyst and noted a prior 2023 DDOT study that found signal-warrant thresholds were not met. The Commission voted 6-0-0 in favor. *[Commissioner Tiffani Nichole Johnson]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 4B – Left turn signal, Georgia Ave & Peabody St NW:** ANC 4B requested DDOT install a dedicated left turn signal to improve access to the Walmart at 5929 Georgia Avenue NW. The resolution stated that the intersection sees heavy pedestrian traffic and that vehicles attempting left turns create dangerous conditions. Adopted 6-0-0. *[Commissioner Tiffani Nichole Johnson]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 5D – Shared mobility device parking:** ANC 5D requested DDOT review and take action on the parking of shared electric scooters and bikes, citing devices blocking sidewalks, ramps, and building entrances throughout the Commission's area, creating accessibility barriers for residents using wheelchairs and strollers. *[Commissioner Charquinta McCray]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 5F – Yield-to-pedestrian and truck route enforcement:** ANC 5F endorsed Bill B26-0439, the Enforcing Yield-to-Pedestrian and Truck Restricted Routes Amendment Act of 2025, and requested a hearing before the Council Committee on Transportation and the Environment. The bill would strengthen enforcement of pedestrian right-of-way rules and truck route restrictions in residential neighborhoods. *[Commissioners Aru Sahni, Joe Bishop-Henchman, Mark Galvan]* ([View resolution](#))

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- **ANC 8F – M Street SE safety corridor metrics:** ANC 6/8F requested that DDOT provide data on the effectiveness of the M Street SE Safety Corridor project, including before-and-after crash statistics, speed data, and pedestrian counts. - **ANC 8F – I Street SE corridor study:** ANC 6/8F requested DDOT conduct a full corridor study of I Street SE within the Commission’s boundaries, citing pedestrian safety, bicycle infrastructure gaps, and conflicts with passenger pick-up/drop-off activity. - **ANC 8F – Curbside signage, 10th Street SE:** ANC 6/8F requested DDOT change curbside signage on the 600 block of 10th Street SE to create a safe pick-up/drop-off zone for ToTH Montessori childcare center. The request cited children being picked up and dropped off in active traffic lanes. [Commissioner Nic Wilson] ([View letter](#))
- **ANC 8F – Residential parking permits:** ANC 6/8F submitted a petition for residential parking permit (RPP) coverage within SMD 6/8F01, citing parking shortages caused by commuter and commercial vehicle encroachment. [Commissioner Nic Wilson] ([View letter](#))

Public Safety

One resolution addressed 911 system accountability.

- **ANC 5F – 911 system failures:** ANC 5F called on the DC Council and Office of Unified Communications (OUC) to address failures in the 911 dispatch system, citing specific incidents where calls were misrouted, including a July 2025 medical emergency where the call was sent to the wrong fire station despite a station being located two blocks from the caller’s home. The resolution requested a full independent audit of OUC operations. [Commissioners Joe Bishop-Henchman & Aru Sahni] ([View resolution](#))

Education, Youth Services & Recreation

Five resolutions from three ANCs addressed school funding, youth mental health services, student safety programs, youth rehabilitation policy, and recreation center hours.

- **ANC 1A – Harriet Tubman ES budget stabilization:** ANC 1A called on DCPS to stabilize the FY27 budget for Harriet Tubman Elementary School, which experienced enrollment declines while students were relocated to temporary swing space during school modernization. The resolution asked DCPS to fund the school at its pre-swing-space enrollment level to avoid staffing cuts as students return. [Commissioner Christine Miller] ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 1A – ChAMPS funding restoration:** ANC 1A supported restoring funding for the Child and Adolescent Mobile Psychiatric Service (ChAMPS), a mobile crisis team that provides on-site psychiatric emergency response to DC schools. The resolution described the service as a critical alternative to police intervention during student mental health crises. [Commissioner Christine Miller] ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 1A – Safe Passage / Safe Blocks FY27 expansion:** ANC 1A called for FY27 funding and expansion of the Safe Passage and Safe Blocks programs, which deploy community ambassadors to ensure student safety along school commute routes and in neighborhoods adjacent to schools, recreation centers, and libraries. The resolution also requested expansion of out-of-school-time (OST) programming. [Commissioner Christine Miller] ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 5F – CARE Act youth rehabilitation:** ANC 5F endorsed Councilmember Zachary Parker’s CARE Act (Coordinating Rehabilitation and Empowerment for Youth), a package of 16 bills focused on youth rehabilitation, diversion programs, and support services as alternatives to incarceration. - **ANC 5D – Extended rec center hours and youth employment:** ANC 5D called on the DC Council and DPR to extend recreation center hours and expand youth employment opportunities at rec centers, citing research from the UCLA Parks After Dark program and University of Chicago Crime Lab showing that extended programming reduces violent crime. The resolution supported Bill 26-132 and proposed MPD community liaisons at rec centers. *[Commissioner Charquinta McCray]* ([View resolution](#))

Health & Human Services

Two resolutions addressed health coverage protections and food access during a federal benefit interruption.

- **ANC 1A – Health coverage and “Keep DC Healthy” campaign:** ANC 1A called on the DC Department of Health Care Finance to protect Medicaid and DC Healthcare Alliance coverage for Columbia Heights families, citing data on coverage losses and poverty rates. The resolution endorsed the “Keep DC Healthy” campaign and identified specific community partners working to maintain enrollment. This was the most extensively footnoted resolution in the January batch. *[Commissioner Christine Miller]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 5D – Grocery store food donations during SNAP interruption:** ANC 5D urged large grocery stores receiving public subsidies to donate edible food products to District residents and community organizations during a SNAP funding interruption, calling on the Department of Small and Local Business Development to facilitate the effort. *[Commissioner Charquinta McCray]* ([View resolution](#))

Libraries, Parks & Public Facilities

Three resolutions from two ANCs addressed library renovations and expansions.

- **ANC 4C – Petworth Library elevator:** ANC 4C resolved that the planned renovation of the Petworth Library should include installation of an elevator to improve ADA accessibility and serve the neighborhood’s aging population. *[Commissioner Brittany Kademian]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 7D – Rosedale Library expansion (to DGS):** ANC 7D wrote to the Department of General Services, DDOT, and DPR requesting coordinated budget and transportation planning for the expansion of the Rosedale Library on the shared DPR/DCPL campus. The letter asked for a traffic and parking study, bikeshare access, and pedestrian improvements to support the expanded facility. ([View letter](#))
- **ANC 7D – Rosedale Library expansion (to DCPL):** ANC 7D separately wrote to DC Public Library in support of the Rosedale Library expansion, urging DCPL to keep the library on its current campus and to plan for increased programming and community space. ([View letter](#))

Business & Liquor Licenses

Two resolutions from ANC 1A involved ABCA license protests.

- **ANC 1A – Buddy’s DC voluntary agreement protest:** ANC 1A filed a protest against Buddy’s, Inc. (t/a Buddy’s DC) and its petition to terminate or amend the voluntary agreement approved on July 25, 2012. The ANC opposed the petition, seeking to maintain the existing operating conditions. *[Commissioner Anthony Thomas-Davis]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 1A – Johnny at Eleventh tavern license protest:** ANC 1A filed a protest of the renewal of the Retailer’s Class C Tavern Alcoholic Beverage License held by Johnny at Eleventh, LLC (t/a Johnny’s All-American). *[Commissioner Anthony Thomas-Davis]* ([View resolution](#))

Environment & Public Works

Three resolutions from two ANCs addressed environmental justice, pest control legislation, and construction debris cleanup.

- **ANC 5F - Ivy City Resilience Hub (B26-0106):** ANC 5F endorsed the Ivy City Resilience Hub Eminent Domain Authority Act of 2025, which would authorize the District to use eminent domain to acquire a chemical manufacturing plant in Ivy City that has operated since 1930. The resolution cited carcinogenic emissions affecting the surrounding residential community and called for the site to be converted into a climate resilience hub. *[Commissioner Aru Sahni]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 5F - Rat abatement legislation:** ANC 5F endorsed two Council bills: B26-0483, addressing rodent-proof waste containers and a public rat abatement dashboard, and B26-0492, requiring the District to replace damaged public trash cans on an accelerated schedule. *[Commissioners Joe Bishop-Henchman, Mark Galvan, Aru Sahni]* ([View resolution](#))
- **ANC 5D - Magnetic alley cleaning equipment:** ANC 5D called on DPW to deploy magnetic cleaning equipment in alleys to collect metal construction debris — nails, screws, and metal shavings — that damages vehicle tires and creates hazards in residential alleyways. *[Commissioner Charquinta McCray]* ([View resolution](#))
